

MISSION FOR MARCH

Farmworkers Self-Help, Inc.

Our March mission focus is our neighbors in Dade City, Farmworkers Self-help, Inc. Their mission is: "To facilitate the self development of the whole person, families & communities toward self-reliance & personal independence, through community organizing, education, advocacy, justice & empowerment, and health among farm workers and other poor."

FSH along with the Resurrection House Mission and their learning center, create many programs for life skills, education, medical care and the basics, such as a food supply. Farm workers are considered "ESSENTIAL" workers in our country. Many are here as registered workers and are paying into our tax system on all the money they make. But they do not qualify for the benefits of regular food banks. RHM and FSH serve more than 150 families a week from their food bank of essential foods (tomato bullion, corn flour, cooking oil, wheat flour, rice and beans). In the fall of 2023, they had already dispensed 274,553 pounds of food.

In 2023 their health care programs expanded to include education about cancers, help for free or reduced cost health screenings, education about Fentanyl and other illegal drugs. Teaching English, help with legal paperwork, applying for passports, and the importance of voting are just a few of their teachings.

Help from churches and other organizations is important to this massive program of self-help managed by RHM & FSH. Your donation should be marked Farm Workers or mission of the month. Please continue prayers for this mission and their work in helping so many of God's people.

Think of your thyroid as a car engine that sets the pace at which your body operates. An engine produces the required amount of energy for a car to move at a certain speed. In the same way, your thyroid gland manufactures enough thyroid hormone to prompt your cells to perform a function at a certain rate.

As many as **30 million Americans** may be affected by <u>thyroid disorders</u>, although more than half remain undiagnosed.

Thyroid disorders are more common amongst women.

Thyroid disorders tend to run in families.

Fatigue is a common complaint for under and overactive thyroid conditions.

TSH testing is the most useful test for thyroid screening.

Regular check-ups are the key to successfully managing a malfunctioning thyroid gland.

Changing formulations and dosage that affect thyroid hormone levels should be followed by retesting.

Do not change your dose of thyroid medication without guidance from your physician.

Thyroid conditions in <u>pregnancy</u> warrant close attention.

<u>Thyroid cancer</u> is one of the fastest growing cancers in America and one of the most curable.





🔤 HOW TO TAKE THE THYROID NECK CHECK 🌌

All you will need is: A. Glass of water B. Handheld mirror

1. Hold the mirror in your hand, focusing on the lower front area of your neck, above the collarbones, and below the voice box (larynx). Your <u>thyroid gland</u> is located in this area of your neck. **2.** While focusing on this area in the mirror, tip your head back. **3.** Take a drink of water and swallow. **4.** As you swallow, look at your neck. Check for any bulges or protrusions in this area when you swallow. Reminder: Don't confuse the Adam's apple with the <u>thyroid gland</u>. The thyroid gland is located further down on your neck, closer to the collarbone. You may want to repeat this process several times. **5.** If you do see any bulges or protrusions in this area, see your physician. You may have an enlarged thyroid gland or a <u>thyroid nodule</u> and should be checked to determine whether <u>cancer</u> is present or if <u>treatment</u> for thyroid disease is needed.

Every time you look in the mirror, a key to your well-being is staring back at your thyroid gland. The thyroid gland is a small, butterfly-shaped gland located in the lower front of the neck, above the collarbones, and below the voice box (larynx). Your thyroid gland makes hormones that help control the function of many of your body's organs, including your heart, brain, liver, kidneys, and skin.
