

In addition, we provide bags for those that have no ability to cook, plus a side table from which they can take one other item. That table offers a variety of miscellaneous items from human and pet food to toiletries and paper products.



- One American dies every hour from skin cancer. The rate of new cases each year is greater than combined cases of breast, prostrate, lung, and colon cancers.
- Melanoma is the 2nd most common form of cancer in young adults ages 15-29 years old. 1 in 5 Americans will develop skin cancer in their lifetimes.
- All ultraviolet radiation whether from the sun or from artificial tanning beds has been proved to be a human carcinogen.
- · All sunburns are evidence of skin damage and can lead not just to skin cancer but other damage issues like wrinkles, blotches, and premature skin aging.
- Sunburns still occur even on cloudy days. Some of the worst burns happen then because the harm caused by penetrating UV rays is not immediately evident.

The Methodist Connection

Ann Reeves Jarvis was a social activist and founder of Mothers' Day Work Clubs., religious based educational groups in the mid 19th century to help teach women practical child care skills and improve home sanitation. Mrs. Jarvis was a lifelong and very active member of Andrews Methodist Episcopal Church in West Virginia.

During the turbulent aftermath of the Civil War, Ann organized a Mother's Friendship Day to help ease local tensions and rebuild social connections. An immediate success, the Day was continued for a number of years.

After Ann's death in 1905, her daughter, Anna Jarvis, organized a small tribute to her mother at Andrews Methodist Church and later directed her energies to establishing a national day honoring Mothers. In 1908, the first official Mother's Day celebrations were held

concurrently in Andrews Methodist Church and the Wanamaker Store Auditorium in Philadelphia. Mother's Day quickly became a national observation.

Despite the success of her campaign, Anna Jarvis soon became disheartened by the commercial and political exploitation of an observation supposed to be focused on the spiritual and social aspects of motherhood.
