

Mission of the Month of October Zephyrhills Pregnancy Center

The Pregnancy Care Center of Zephyrhills is our mission focus for October.

It is a local faith-based ministry that believes in the sanctity of life for all who come through their doors. The center is available to counsel individuals to make wise decisions for themselves and their families.

With a network of resources, they are dedicated to equip, empower and support the women and children who seek help at our facility.

Unlike other Pregnancy Care Centers, they do not sever the ties with the mothers when the child reaches the age of one year. Their goal is to help these young families become contributing members to the community.

The center accomplishes this goal by offering life-skill classes, Bible study (in both English and Spanish) and individual mentoring. By attending these classes the clients can earn "baby bucks" which they can use to purchase supplies in their Baby Store.

The Pregnancy Care Center is a non-profit and they survive on donations from churches and individuals. They employ only one staff member and rely heavily on their volunteer support staff.


Truthseekers'

Results of Sunday's Church Conference: Realignment to the Global Methodist Church

On Sunday, September 17, our church members voted 93.75% to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church and subsequently voted 100% to affiliate to the Global Methodist Church. Our denominational realignment will become effective at the end of 2023. Though it was a momentous occasion, the atmosphere was friendly and peaceful, and I have deep gratitude for Rev. Dr. David Allen, our District Superintendent, and Marissa Carnevale, the Senior Administrative Assistant for our district. They led our Church Conference gracefully and efficiently.

I am also deeply grateful for our church leaders and members who have been prayerfully considering the most fitting denominational affiliation for our church for three years now. Living through uncertainty is challenging. With Sunday's vote offering us overwhelming clarity on the best denominational alignment for our church family, we can now move onward and upward, joining God on a journey of bringing new life, reconciliation, and the presence of Christ to all people, and helping each person reflect the character of Christ.

We'll be working over the next few months to make the necessary legal and administrative changes to make this denominational realignment a reality, and we'll have a big church-wide celebration in early 2024 to commemorate realigning to the Global Methodist Church. Our new name is our pre-1968 name: *First Methodist Church of Zephyrhills*. You'll eventually notice changes in our logo, signage, and other aspects of our "church brand." But when it comes to our ministries, our worship services, our missions partnerships, and our church leadership, we don't foresee dramatic changes—at least, not related to becoming part of the Global Methodist Church. Any changes in ministries will come as we keep discerning how to get better in our mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ who worship passionately, love extravagantly, and witness boldly. These changes would have happened regardless of denominational alignment. We're always striving to get better at fulfilling our church's mission!

For those of you who are disappointed with the results of the vote, I know it's discouraging to feel like you're on the losing side of a vote or that your perspectives are a minority point-of-view. But I assure you that you are still loved and welcomed here at First Methodist Church of Zephyrhills! We have always had and always will have people in our church family who disagree over certain aspects of the Christian life. As long as we keep Christ at the center of our lives, there will always be room at His table for all His people.

To learn more about the Global Methodist Church, visit www.globalmethodist.org. It is a rapidly growing worldwide denomination operating in all 50 states with over 3,200 local churches and two active bishops so far. It offers much greater clarity and unity around who we are and what we believe than what we've experienced as United Methodists for decades. Our church will become part of the South-Central district, one of four districts in the Florida Conference of the Global Methodist Church. The key thing to know is that by becoming part of the Global Methodist Church, we can remain as we have been: Methodist Christians devoted to historic Christianity with a high view of Scripture and the pursuit of holiness of heart and life in partnership with Christians of all denominational traditions.

It's an honor for me to serve as the appointed pastor of First Methodist Church of Zephyrhills, and though God never promises tomorrow (Proverbs 27:1), I hope and pray to be able to serve the wonderful people of this church for a long time!
