Dear Members of First United Methodist Church of Zephyrhills,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

The United Methodist Church (UMC) has been in debate over human sexuality and obedience to *The Book of Discipline* for several decades. In recent years the conflict reached a point where civil debate was replaced by hostile protests and uncivil dialogue. The denomination is at a place where in order to have peace, we must have a "Paul and Barnabas moment" (Acts 15:36-41), with churches serving the Lord on separate paths for the sake of the mission. Then Methodists on both paths can cease with conflict and dedicate themselves to making disciples of Jesus Christ.

Our church's Administrative Council has been in prayerful discernment for several years about where God is leading our church. After multiple congregational meetings for information, prayer, and discernment, and after surveying our members on the issues at hand, we engaged in legal action with 105 other churches (later 71 other churches) in the spring of 2022 to negotiate a path out of the UMC and into the Global Methodist Church (GMC). This action was in response to the unreasonable cost and measures levied by conference

leadership. At the time, this was the most prudent course of action we could take to stay faithful to Methodist theology and tradition since the UMC is clearly going in a different direction.

On April 18, 2023, the judge dismissed the case based on past legal precedents about church and state matters in Florida. Realizing that winning upon appeal was highly unlikely and knowing the deadline for disaffiliation through ¶ 2553 is rapidly approaching (December 31, 2023), our Administrative Council voted on April

26 to withdraw from the lawsuit and to instead disaffiliate from the UMC under ¶ 2553 in *The Book of Discipline*. In addition, the exit fees for our church, which allow us to keep our property and assets, are much smaller than were anticipated at this time last year.

All full members of First United Methodist Church of Zephyrhills are invited to a **Church Conference** vote on whether to reaffiliate from the UMC to the GMC on **Sunday, September 17 at 1:00pm** in our sanctuary. This Church Conference will be led by our district superintendent or a representative from the district office. We will vote to disaffiliate from the UMC or to remain in the UMC. Following that vote, we will take a second vote to reaffiliate with the GMC. To make it easier for members to remain after our worship services for this Church Conference, we are providing lunch in Cooper Hall 12:00-12:45pm (sandwiches, drinks, etc.) thanks to a few generous donors. You are invited to come eat lunch with your church family, then head to the

sanctuary's main doors (on 5th Avenue) to check in for the Church Conference before 1:00pm.

In order for members to prepare for the vote, let us clarify a few items:

If we vote to disaffiliate from the UMC:

Our exit fees payable to the Florida Conference will be \$102,768, which will allow us to retain all our assets and property. We also anticipate another \$20,000 of expenses for rebranding and marketing related to our reaffiliation from the UMC to the GMC. The bottom-line projected cost to our church is \$122,768. Our Moving Forward fund, set up last year for this purpose, now has approximately \$23,000.

Our church leaders are trusting that God will provide the path forward financially, with your help. We ask that you prayerfully consider giving to the Moving Forward fund allowing us to exit the UMC without incurring any debt. Please contact church treasurer Peter Jordan, finance chair Julie Cotton, or pastor Steve Ezra to let one of them know how much you are willing to give toward the exit fees.

Whatever is left unfunded after donations and gifts will be paid for by a foundation or credit union loan. Both the Wesleyan Investment Foundation and the Florida United Methodist Foundation are offering competitive terms on loans for exiting churches. As part of the GMC, our annual apportionments will be reduced by approximately 50% compared to the UMC, and our property and liability insurance will see a reduction. Therefore, within five years most of the exit fees would be paid back via cost savings in these two areas.

If we vote to disaffiliate from the UMC, we will immediately seek an additional vote to approve affiliation with the GMC. Our Church would be renamed "First Methodist Church of Zephyrhills" and the UMC logos will be removed from our property and communications over the next few months. Pastor Steve plans to remain as the pastor of our congregation and will transfer his credentials to the GMC. No staffing changes are anticipated.

If we vote to NOT disaffiliate from the UMC:

Our church will agree to prioritize the ongoing mission and ministry of the United Methodist Church as a continuing part of the denomination and will cease conversations about disaffiliation. This will end the matter and the church will submit to the current leadership of the United Methodist Church denominationally and in Florida. Pastor Steve will leave our church, transferring his credentials to the GMC, and the bishop will appoint a new pastor to First United Methodist Church of Zephyrhills.

Who can vote on September 17?

Only those who are active and official members of the church may vote. *The Book of Discipline* does not allow affiliate members to vote. If you are unsure of your membership status, please contact the church office to confirm your status. Voting must be done in person on that day; there will be no early, remote, or proxy voting.

You can observe the Church Conference if you are not a member, but we request you sit in the balcony.

All full members of First United Methodist Church of Zephyrhills are invited to a Church Conference on **Sunday, September 17 at 1:00pm** in our sanctuary to vote on whether to reaffiliate from the United Methodist Church to the Global Methodist Church.

This Church Conference will be led by our district superintendent or a representative from our conference or district. We will first vote on disaffiliating from the United Methodist Church. If the disaffiliation vote passes by 2/3 of all present and voting members, we will then vote on affiliating with the Global Methodist Church, which will require a simple majority vote (over 1/2 of all present and voting members). **Please bring a photo ID to confirm your membership.**

To make it easier for members to remain after our worship services for this Church Conference, we are providing lunch in Cooper Hall 12:00-12:45pm (sandwiches, drinks, etc.) thanks to a few generous donors. You are invited to eat lunch with your church family and then head to the sanctuary's main doors (on 5th Avenue) to check in for the Church Conference before 1:00pm.

Disposable razor



While the exact cause of prostate cancer is unknown, certain **risk factors** have been identified that may increase the chance of developing the disease:

Age: Age is the strongest predictor for developing prostate cancer. Prostate cancer is primarily found in men over age 55, and the average age of diagnosis is 70.3

Race and ethnicity: <u>African-American men</u> are disproportionately affected by prostate cancer, with an incidence rate more than **60** percent higher than white males.

Genetics: Having a father or brother with prostate cancer more than doubles a man's risk of developing the disease. Weight: Men with a body mass index higher than 32.5 have about a one-third greater risk

Symptoms and Detection

There are generally no **Signs or symptoms** for early-stage prostate cancer, and some symptoms can be easily mistaken for those of other disorders.

Common symptoms of prostate cancer may include pelvic pain, frequent or painful urination, blood in the urine, painful ejaculation, weight loss, lack of appetite, and bone pain

Medical experts who encourage **regular screening** recommend that all men who have a life expectancy of at least 10 years should be offered the PSA test and DRE annually **beginning at age 50.**

They also recommend offering screening tests earlier to African-American men, and men who have a father or brother with prostate cancer.

If your PSA test or DRE suggests a problem, your doctor most likely will refer you to a urologist. Additional testing is necessary to determine if the problem is cancer or something else.
