
Youth and Family Ministries [Team Leader ~ Karen Ezra]

There was no traffic around, so I pulled to the side of the road and I slept an hour. When I woke, I was refreshed and started on my way again.

I arrived at Joe's school just as his program started. He was dressed as a white bunny. His dad had fashioned bunny ears for him from pipe cleaners, and he hopped across the stage stopping to sniff the flowers, pet the butterflies, and tweet at the song birds. I saw it all! Thank you Lord!



Is the Grinch Stealing Your Christmas?
Handling Holiday Stress
Finding new perspectives on this
Christmas season can help to recenter
our expectations, goals, and priorities
so that we can rediscover the
joy and peace that was
given to us through
Christ's humble birth so long ago.

Do you remember the popular movie, *The Grinch Who Stole Christmas?* The Grinch observed the people of Whoville happily preparing for Christmas. He decided to go down to their village and steal their joy. Many Grinches threaten to steal our joy and peace at Christmastime. We think we are buying just the right gift for someone, but it receives a cool reception. The rush of the season, long lines, and slow traffic replace our joy with frustration. Some relatives try our patience. After the season passes, unmet expectations dampen our spirit and the holiday blues move in. With the arrival of the New Year, we are relieved the Christmas stress has passed instead of being refreshed by the promise of Christ. More than we would like to admit, we allow the stress of the Christmas season to be the Grinch that comes into our hearts to steal our joy. However, with a revived perspective, God can give us a transformed heart so that our circumstances don't dictate our attitude. The new perspective we need is this

G.R.I.N.C.H. God Reached Into the world Now Christ brings Hope

WAYS TO RECENTER PERSPECTIVE TO FIND THE PEACE AND JOY OF CHRISTMAS

- **Listen** Inaugurate the season by treating yourself to a CD or ONLINE music of Christmas classics, not songs of White Christmas or Chestnuts Roasting on an Open Fire, but great hymns such as Joy to the World or Angels from the Realms of Glory.
- **Read** Open up the Bible to the Gospel of Luke and read the familiar story with new eyes. Remember Mary's story as you encounter aggravating people and circumstances over the holidays.
- **Reduce** Do you really need to throw a Christmas party in your home, host the school party, bake cookies, decorate like Martha Stewart, send cards, or buy multiple gifts? Give yourself permission to decline an invitation, buy rather than bake cookies, or skip the Christmas cards so that you can maintain room in your heart for worship.
- Adjust Set expectations to match your reality. Life doesn't turn out perfect and neither does
 the holiday season.. As you experience disappointment around you, keep in mind that Christ
 entered into a broken world to bring healing and peace. Though you can't change others, ask
 God to work in your heart so that you can exemplify His love, joy, peace, and patience to the
 hurting world surrounding you.

A photo, found recently on the web caught my interest. Dated May 17, 1963, the black and white image showed our sanctuary in the midst of being built, with it's steeple still on the ground nearby, surrounded by metal and wood scaffolding. The photo is attributed to Mrs. William Enyart, wife of a local bakery owner.

Sixty years later, the photo at left demonstrates the lasting legacy that construction has left, not just to our church family, but to the city of Zephyrhills at large.
