A safe harbor is usually a naturally occurring inlet where ships of all kinds may find anchorage secure from storms and heavy seas. Such a location attracts attention and regular use so over time, communities of sea-faring folks build up in and around the water, growing steadily over time, adding land-focused support and services. A truly safe harbor rarely remains unpopulated for long and quite often grows into a hub of activities and services that reach for out miles around. Those who call the harbor home are not exempt from the severities of sea storms, but by its natural security and a strong sense of shared purpose that it promotes, the harbor offers a unique resilience and tenacity that weathers even the worst the sea has to offer.

Not unlike our church and many in our area where, attracted by the assurances of God's word and building a shared community on that faith, we find a safe harbor in which to anchor together against life's storms. And like those harbor towns, our unique security allows us to build on our blessings and be there to reach out to others in times of trouble and to minister through the assurances we find by anchoring in a Christ-like way of life.





In the calmer days after intense experiences such as we had with the recent storms, are often the times when we begin to experience depression or additional anxiety, reliving parts of the crisis or second guessing decisions made in haste. If these thoughts start impacting our ability to move forward and return to a "normal" daily routine, spending some time with a willing friend and counselor can be just that "medicine for melancholy". Here's what one Stephen Minister writes about their calling:

Stephen Ministers will never talk about their experience with a care receiver because Stephen Ministers are pledged to total confidentiality. However, a person who has met with a Stephen Minister may tell of their experience. Here is an experience from an actual Stephen Ministry care receiver:

Susan tells us, "Although my needs changed as I went from wife to caregiver to widow, my Stephen Minister's love and support remained a constant. She was there at every stage of my journey, helping me through some of the most difficult moments of my life—so I could begin to heal."

Many of us are feeling sad, depressed, or lost by the recent storms. It's difficult to look at piles of debris as we clean up and repair our homes and see our neighbors who have lost everything. We are blessed to have and active group of Stephen Ministers available now to meet with people. Open Arms Village [A local ministry supported this month by our Commission on Missions]

Open Arms Village of Ocala Florida has a mission to combat homelessness by providing transitional housing to men and women in need and supportive services to equip them to become independent, productive members of the community. St. Mark's United Methodist Church established their men's facility in 2015.

Open Arms Village is more than a homeless shelter. It's a restoration program. Residents are carefully screened to determine their desire and their willingness to do what it takes to become self-sufficient. They receive case management and other supportive services to help them overcome the challenges that keep them homeless.

Open Arms Village has received approval from the Ocala Planning & Zoning Commission for a zoning change that would clear the way for the establishment of 16 bed facility for women at the southwest corner of Southeast 17th Street and Lake Weir Avenue. This property belonged to the former Druid Hills United Methodist Church which closed in 2018.

Our missions team voted to send \$250 to Open Arms Village to assist with purchase of some needed supplies for these women in transition as they seek to expand their mission to include homeless and abused women. Our Women in Faith group has been involved with this ministry.

WHAT IS DIABETES?

People with diabetes either don't make enough insulin (type 1 diabetes, autoimmune disorder) or can't use insulin properly (type 2 diabetes). Insulin allows blood sugar (glucose) to enter cells, where it can be used for energy. When the body doesn't have enough insulin or can't use it effectively, blood sugar builds up in the blood. **High blood sugar levels can lead to heart disease, stroke, blindness, kidney failure, and amputation of toes, feet, or legs.**

SOME FACTS ABOUT DIABETES

- Diabetes is the 7th leading cause of death in the United States.
- Diabetes is the leading cause of kidney failure, lower limb amputation, and adult-onset blindness.
- Risk factors include being overweight, having a family history of type 2 diabetes, being
 physically active less than three times a week, or having a fasting blood sugar result above 100.

HEALTH COMPLICATIONS FROM DIABETES

- Heart disease and stroke: People with diabetes are twice as likely to have heart disease or a stroke as people without diabetes—and at an earlier age.
- Blindness and other eye problems: Diabetic retinopathy (damage to blood vessels in the retina), cataracts (clouding of the lens), and glaucoma (increase in fluid pressure in the eye) can all result in vision loss.
- Kidney disease: High blood sugar levels can damage the kidneys long before a person has symptoms. Kidney damage can cause chronic kidney disease, which can lead to kidney failure.
- Amputations: Diabetes damages blood vessels and nerves, particularly in the feet, and can lead to serious, hard-to-treat infections. Amputation is sometimes necessary to stop the spread

PREDIABETES: OPPORTUNITY FOR CHANGE

More than a third of American adults—around 86 million—have prediabetes, and 90% of them don't know it. With prediabetes, blood sugar levels are higher than normal, but not high enough yet to be diagnosed as diabetes. People with prediabetes have an increased risk of developing type 2 diabetes, heart disease, and stroke.


