
REFUEL HAS RETURNED

Miriam Circle is Back!

Who is Miriam?

Moses' Sister - who watched over baby Moses as he floated into the Nile River to escape Pharoah's order to kill all the male Jewish infants. Miriam's quick wit as a young girl helped change the course of Israel's history by protecting its greatest spiritual leader.

Later in her life she became a leader and prophetess among Jewish women. After the crossing of the Red Sea, Miriam led the Israelite women in praise to God for their miraculous deliverance. In Exodus 15:20, we find a recounting of this event:

"Then Miriam the prophet, Aaron's sister, took a timbrel in her hand, and all the women followed her, with timbrels and dancing. ²¹ Miriam sang to them:

"Sing to the LORD, for he is highly exalted. Both horse and driver he has hurled into the sea."





On Monday, September 9th, Miriam Circle of United Women in Faith of First Methodist Church resumed its meetings beginning with prayer and devotions. They continued with a discussion of UWF business and then the group sharing of joys and concerns.


MISSIONS: Community Outreach


Spotlight < Cedar Key Book Drive

At the end of August last year, Category 4 Hurricane, Idalia, blew up along the west coast of Florida and made landfall at the small fishing and tourist town of Cedar Key, one of our favorite places to go to relax and eat some of the best sea food our west coast has to offer. Jutting into the Gulf in the Big Bend area of Florida, the tiny town has seen its share of major storms. Idalia sent major storm surge directly into the center of town and caused major water damage to many homes and businesses, a number of which are still being repaired over a year later.

Right about this time I was considering paring down my personal library so I contacted the Cedar Key librarian to ask if they would be interested in receiving book donations to replace any that were damaged in the flood waters. Luckily, many of the books had been moved to a more secure location inland, but the library itself suffered extensive interior damage that required a year of repair, remodeling, brand new electrical work and all new shelves at great expense. Seeing the full extent of the need, I opened up the donation drive to our members and was gratified by the swift and generous response that ultimately filled 18 boxes with books of all types and genres, and all in excellent condition.

Unfortunately, repairs to the little library dragged on for months as the flooded 1st floor was gutted, rebuilt, rewired, and repainted. At last, as the one year storm anniversary approached, a full set of brand new book shelves were obtained and set up, and the arduous task of returning and reshelving all the books began. In mid-September, Teresia and I rented a mini-van and drove the books up to Cedar Key. Ironically, the day proved to be wet and rainy, but the trip was made successfully and all the donated books arrived without incident and are now stacked neatly in a side hallway waiting to be sorted, labeled, and shelved along with the other returning books. The library's goal is to open back up for their town readers by the end of this month.

Sadly, we saw in the news that a major part of the Cedar Key dock business area, including our favorite restaurant, Steamers, caught fire and was heavily damaged just a week before Hurricane Helene roared ashore with destructive storm surge. Please keep the folks of Cedar Key in your prayers as their strength and tenacity continue to be tested daily.

YOUR BEST PROTECTION AGAINST FLU

Millions of people get flu every year, hundreds of thousands of people are hospitalized and thousands or tens of thousands of people die.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), public health professionals, and our practice recommend that everyone 6 months of age and older should get a flu vaccine every year. Flu vaccination can reduce flu illnesses, doctors' visits, and missed work and school due to flu, as well as prevent serious flu complications that can result in hospitalization and even death. A flu vaccine is the best way to help prevent flu and its potentially serious complications. Remember that flu vaccine not only protects you, but it also can help protect those around you.

FLU VACCINE REDUCES YOUR RISK OF FLU



During the 2019-2020 influenza season, influenza vaccination prevented an estimated 7.5 million illnesses, 105,000 hospitalizations, and 6,300 deaths associated with influenza.⁴



Recent studies show that flu vaccination reduces the risk of flu illness by between 40% and 60% among the overall population during seasons when most circulating flu viruses are well-matched to the flu vaccine.



During the 2019-2020 influenza season, there were 199 influenza-related pediatric deaths reported to CDC. A CDC study was the first of its kind to show that influenza vaccination can significantly reduce a child's risk of dying from influenza.⁵

While some people who get a flu vaccine still get sick, vaccination can make their illness less severe. Two recent studies among hospitalized flu patients showed that flu vaccination reduced intensive care unit admissions and duration of hospitalization.

Remember that a flu vaccine not only protects you, but it also can help protect those around you, including people who are at higher risk for serious flu illness, like babies, young children, older adults, pregnant people, and people with certain chronic health conditions.

FLU VACCINATION ESPECIALLY IMPORTANT FOR SOME

Flu vaccination is especially important for people who are at higher risk of developing serious complications from flu, including children younger than 5, pregnant people, adults 65 and older, and people with certain chronic health conditions, such as diabetes, heart disease, and asthma.

Our local <u>not for profit</u> hospitals are once again combining efforts to conduct the 2024 Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA). This shared data collection strategy ensures we're able to capture robust data and hear from more community members, particularly those underserved to support the development of programs and services to meet community needs. 




Charge Conference Celebration with Carry-in Luncheon October 12th
