## Youth and Family Ministries [Team Leader ~ Karen Ezra]



Here's a brief overview of what the Walk to Emmaus entails:


- 1. **Three-Day Experience**: The retreat typically lasts for 72 hours, starting on Thursday evening and ending on Sunday evening.

To assist beyond food needs, we continue to partner with the Thrift Store to provide \$10 coupons for household goods and clothing items.

### MARCH IS THYROID AWARENESS MONTH

Think of your thyroid as a car engine that sets the pace at which your body operates. An engine produces the required amount of energy for a car to move at a certain speed. In the same way, your thyroid gland manufactures enough thyroid hormone to prompt your cells to perform a function at a certain rate.

- As many as **30 million Americans** may be affected by <u>thyroid disorders</u>, although more than half remain undiagnosed.
- Thyroid disorders are more common amongst women.
- Thyroid disorders tend to run in families.
- Fatigue is a common complaint for under and <u>overactive thyroid conditions</u>.
- TSH testing is the most useful test for thyroid screening.
- Regular check-ups are the key to successfully managing a malfunctioning thyroid gland.
- Changing formulations and dosage that affect thyroid hormone levels should be followed by retesting.
- Do not change your dose of thyroid medication without guidance from your physician.
- Thyroid conditions in <u>pregnancy</u> warrant close attention.
- Thyroid cancer is one of the fastest growing cancers in America and one of the most curable.

### **HOW TO TAKE THE THYROID NECK CHECK**

#### ALL YOU NEED IS A GLASS OF WATER AND A HAND-HELD MIRROR

- 1. Hold the mirror in your hand, focusing on the lower front area of your neck, above the collarbones, and below the voice box (larynx). Your thyroid gland is located in this area of your neck.
- 2. While focusing on this area in the mirror, tip your head back.
- 3. Take a drink of water and swallow.
- 4. As you swallow, look at your neck. Check for any bulges or protrusions in this area when you swallow. Reminder: Don't confuse the Adam's apple with the <a href="thyroid gland">thyroid gland</a>. The thyroid gland is located further down on your neck, closer to the collarbone. You may want to repeat this process several times.
- 5. If you do see any bulges or protrusions in this area, see your physician. You may have an enlarged thyroid gland or a <u>thyroid nodule</u> and should be checked to determine whether <u>cancer</u> is present or if <u>treatment</u> for thyroid disease is needed.

Every time you look in the mirror, a key to your well-being is staring back at your thyroid gland. The thyroid gland is a small, butterfly-shaped gland located in the lower front of the neck, above the collarbones, and below the voice box (larynx). Your thyroid gland makes hormones that help control the function of many of your body's organs, including your heart, brain, liver, kidneys, and skin. Making sure that your thyroid gland is healthy is important to your body's overall well-being.



## Giving Back [Supporting and expanding the ministries of our church family]

At First Methodist Church of Zephyrhills we appreciate the sacrifices and commitment that you and your family make to your church home. It is our goal to provide our members with several convenient options for their regular giving.

#### Automatic Bank Transaction

Most banks have the ability to do automatic bill pay. It is simple and easy to set up and once established continues without interruption. Access your bank's bill pay features and choose a new pay to account. You can choose the amount, frequency, and duration of your payments. Please make sure your contribution is sent to:

#### Automatic Bank Draft

The church has the ability to set up a batch file through our bank that will draft from your checking account 2x each month. This is similar to the Vanco giving as you will need to provide your account number plus the routing number for a one time setup. Usually there are two separate batches each month so you can choose to give, for example, on the 5th or 20th of the month. There is no fee charged to the church for this service. Contact our Church Treasurer in the church office to sign up.

#### Secure Online Transaction

First Methodist Church of Zephyrhills has partnered with Vanco to provide safe processing of church secure contributions using credit cards, debit cards, and bank accounts. Vanco provides these services to many churches across America and is a partner with the Global Methodist Church. With this option you can choose the frequency and the amount of your contribution. The preferred method and most economical for FMCZ is to utilize bank draft.

#### Offering Envelopes

You can order a book of offering envelopes that are dated for each Sunday to use in placing your tithes and offerings in the offering plate each week. These offering envelopes are ordered annually and can be picked up in the narthex or church ofwce in December. This is a great benewt because the envelopes are already preprinted with your family name and number, and the weekly envelopes are a good reminder. If you would like to receive envelopes or cancel your envelopes, contact our Church Treasurer in the church office.

#### Plate Offering

Simply place your offering in the plate each Sunday as it passes you.

To ensure that your contribution is credited to your account for tax purposes, please clearly mark your envelope with your family name.

#### **Donating Appreciated Stock**

The IRS allows for donation of appreciated stock to a qualiwed 503c organization. This methods requires some setup with the church. If you are interested in this, please contact our Church Treasurer in the church ofwce.
